ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Educational Efforts:

The Guild coordinates an annual symposium held each January. Additionally, a summer meeting and multiple workshops are held throughout the year.

Legislative Efforts:

The Guild helped secure legislation for the following items:

- Development of the Indiana Wine Grape Council based at Purdue University, which provides enology, viticulture and marketing assistance to the wine and grape industry in Indiana
- Sunday sales and operating hours for Indiana wineries
- Ability to open a second sales outlet
- Wine sampling and sales at trade fairs and festivals
- Increased production limits to 500,000 gallons—up from 100,000 gallons
- Development of the Ohio River Valley American Viticulture Area
- Production and sale of fortified wines
- Ability to hold a distillers permit for the production and sale of brandy
