Brown County Winery; Popularity leads to a second location

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - A new production facility, larger tasting room and expanded gift shop are no longer dreams for Brown County Winery, they are a reality. A second winery location opened in the end of September, five minutes east of Nashville on Highway 46 in downtown Gnawbone. The original winery, located in downtown Nashville is a popular tourist attraction. So popular, that an expansion was necessary to handle wine requests and customers. Due to limited space in the main shopping district, owners Dave and Cindy Schrodт decided to place the new winery on the outskirts of town.

Nestled at the foot of a hill near the entrance to Brown County State Park, the winery location is ideal for those visitors hoping to take a break from the hustle and bustle of downtown. "Visitors can enjoy free wine tasting, view the wine production area through two large windows and relax on the front porch," says Cindy Schrodт, co-owner.

The winery currently produces eight wines and plans to add new wines as production grows. Brown County Winery, open since 1986, joined the Indiana wine scene in the early days. "Passion for wine, dedication to quality and commitment to customers has made Brown County Winery the popular stop that it is," says Sally Linton of the Indiana Wine Grape Council. "We expect to see the success of the winery continue to grow as the Indiana wine industry expands."
