Local Entertainers Perform at Vintage Indiana Festival

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. - Jennie DeVoe, Dog Talk and the Gordon Bonham Blues Band will entertain the crowd while 15 Indiana wineries pour their award winning wines at the Vintage Indiana Wine & Food Festival on Saturday, June 9th from 11AM to 8PM at Military Park in downtown Indianapolis.

Vintage Indiana is the only festival in the state that brings Indiana wineries to one central location for public tastings. Sally Linton, marketing specialist for the Indiana Wine Grape Council, the festival's developer, said most of the wineries have won medals in international wine competitions over the past year. "Many of the wines featured at this year's festival have been highly honored by experts the wine industry. This festival provides an excellent opportunity for people to visit many of the Indiana wineries and taste their wines right here in Indianapolis. While people are tasting and matching food with award winning wines produced in our state, they can also listen to and enjoy award winning entertainers," said Linton, who herself is a certified wine judge for international competitions.

At 6-7:30PM one of Indianapolis' newest and brightest young singers, Jennie DeVoe will grace the WTTS Stage. At 4-5:30 PM, Dog Talk, Nuvo's "Best of Indianapolis" for the past four years will take to the stage. And to start off the festival at 1:30 will be the Gordon Bonham Blues Band.

Advance adult tickets for Vintage Indiana are available for \$12 at all participating wineries and at Marsh Supermarkets, or \$15 at the gate. Designated drivers tickets are also available for \$8.
